Our activities so far have been carried out across 14 states comprising Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Manipur, Odisha, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal.

Governments implement several programs and policies, most of which are directed towards the betterment of the rural poor, with the aim of ending poverty across dimensions. REEDS is actively engaged with many prestigious, interpretive studies and expository evaluations related to socio-economic development programs.

Some of our key interventions include:

- Impact Study on the Direct Benefit Transfer System in MGNREGS for Commissioner of Rural Development, Government of Andhra Pradesh.
- National-level monitoring of Rural Development Programs of Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India in 7 States covering over 60 districts.
- Verification of Open Defecation-free declared villages for Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation, Government of India and also Government of Andhra Pradesh covering 6 States, 19 Districts, 336 Blocks, 11,000+ villages, and 4,30,000 + households.
- Base-line Survey of Horticulture Activities towards creation of a credible database of horticulture stakeholders covering 8000

farmers for the Department of Horticulture, Government of Andhra Pradesh.



RURAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP

Creating entrepreneurs who can create more.

Close to 70% of India's rural households still depend primarily on Agriculture for their livelihood. Sustainable agriculture in terms of food security, rural employment, and environmentally sustainable technologies are essential for holistic rural development. REEDS believes that Agriculture and its allied sectors-based economy play a more meaningful role in the economy and consequent contribution towards equitable economic growth.

Our key interventions include:

- Collaborative efforts in partnership with National Institute of Agricultural Marketing, Government of India, to promote Agri-start-ups.
- Initiated a joint interventional pilot for 'Promoting Agriprenurship and skills in rural areas through convergence of development programs' aimed at building a comprehensive skills delivery mechanism in rural areas.
- Piloted a 'Resource Center' for providing knowledge and support for practical and commercial usage on renewable energy towards sustainable rural development and livelihoods promotion in cooperation with the Department of Economic and Social Affairs of United Nations.
- In alliance with APITCO, initiated the process of publishing literature and extend training for commercial usage of knowledge that would help establish and develop Agriprenureship and create rural employment.



SANITATION & HYGIENE

Making sanitation and hygiene all-pervasive.

REEDS has been a proud participant with best-in-class field-level expertise in many interventions related to Swachh Bharat Mission and WASH, incorporating capacity-building, behaviour change and verifications in partnership with UNICEF and other national, state, and district-level agencies. Successful completion of several massive assignments reflects REEDS' capability and expertise in its on-schedule quality service deliveries.

Our key interventions in this area include:

- Preparation of GP-specific Detailed Project Reports for implementation of SLWM Projects meeting the objectives of National Sanitation Missions for 350+ GPs in Andhra Pradesh for Swachh Andhra Corporation.
- Field verification of ODF Status under SBM(G) and NRRDWP schemes in 11000+ villages in 6 States as an empanelled Institutional National-level Monitor (NLM) with the Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation, Government of India and Swachh Andhra Corporation. We are proud of this achievement, for having carried verification of ODF declared villages in highest numbers in the country.
- A district-level WASH Resource Centre to strengthen capacity-building efforts under Swachh Bharat Mission. This was a first-of-its-kind IT-enabled telephone-based replicable intervention model, implemented in collaboration with UNICEF.
- Total Sanitation Campaign in 55 Gram Panchayats towards making them 'Nirmal Gram'. In fact, 36 of these 55 Gram Panchayats were recipients of the prestigious national award 'Nirmal Gram Puraskar 2008'.
- 'Trainers' Orientation Program' in association with Charlton Brown, Australia, to enhance professional learning and development of basic instructional skills towards fulfilling the role of sanitation and hygiene-care trainers in service delivery systems.
- Hygiene education campaigns 'Promoting use of toilet, creating awareness on hand-washing at the right times and sharing tasks among school children' covering over 3,00,000 school children at over 7,000 schools in Andhra Pradesh for Department of Rural Water Supply, Government of Andhra Pradesh, UNICEF.

SAFE DRINKING WATER

Taking clean water to the last mile.

[Associated with SDG 6 of 'Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all' & National and State Rural Drinking Water Missions]

Lack of consumable drinking water is a major problem that not just rural India is affected by, but even parts of urban India are reeling under. REEDS, for over 15 years, has been endeavouring to bridge the gap in promoting community-managed safe drinking-water systems, strengthening operation & maintenance, and access to knowledge and practice of households about the use of safe water by working with State Water and Sanitation Missions/Departments of Rural Sanitation and Water Supply of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Odisha, and various District Water and Sanitation Committees.

Our key interventions in this area include:

- Development of a low-cost and easy-to-maintain 'Multi-stage Micro Water Filtration System' – MWF evaluated by relevant agencies as suitable for its effectiveness, efficiency, adaptability, and consumer acceptance, for sustainable and safe drinking-water supplies in rural communities.
- Design and introduction of state-of-the-art Mobile Unit is one of the many pioneering efforts of REEDS in addressing safe drinking-water needs during calamities and also meeting the drinking water needs of remote rural communities.
- Establishment of MWF plants in over 80 locations in Andhra Pradesh, Orissa, and Karnataka, with combined capacity being about 50 million litres of safe drinking water treatment per day. These projects cover over 6 lakh rural population.
- Customizing a gravitation-oriented drinking water treatment system for a tiny hilly tribal habitation in Andhra Pradesh located at an altitude of 1450 MSL with 500 population that too without any access to power.
- Campaigns for creation of awareness among user-community and other stakeholders on Operation & Maintenance of Drinking Water Schemes under Swajaldhara in over 1800 villages spread in Andhra Pradesh.
- REEDS, in partnership with The Andhyodaya, a Kerala-based NGO and winner of coveted UNESCO's Best Rain Water-harvesting NGO in the country, established over 80 Roof-top Rain-water Harvesting Structures in specified schools in Andhra Pradesh.

Our key interventions in this area include:

- Initiating a series of Life Skills and Livelihood Skills International conferences aimed at developing the skill levels for sustainable rural economies and general quality of life in rural India.
- Organized 5 international conferences in a series that focused on skill-development of rural Indians. All these conferences addressed vital aspect of skill progress.
- Established cooperative relationships with industry and academia in the areas of vocational training and skills development.
- Empanelled as Assessing Body under the erstwhile Skill Development Initiative Scheme of Directorate General of Employment and Training, Ministry of Labour & Employment, Government of India for 3 specified sectors.
- As part of Make in India initiative, conducted ZED (Zero Defect Zero Effect) Model awareness programmes among MSMEs across all Telangana Districts in association with LSLSI and FISME.


